## KING FOOTBALL TAKES THE STAGE LAUNCESTON'S BIG DAY

Today is the day to which the whole of Tasmania and particularly Northern Tasmania has looked forward for the last few months.

To Tasmanians generally, any day on which eighteen athletes take the field wearing the rose, primrose and myrtle of the State, is an occasion of excitement. When there are thirty-six athletes in those colours as there will be today, it is even more thrilling. But to fans in Launceston and surrounding districts this is the biggest day's football they have ever known. Never before has the V.F.L. met a Tasmanian team at York Park. Thirteen times the two teams have met but this is the first time they will have done so in Launceston.

This is the opportunity for football followers in Launceston to see the legendary might of the Victorian Football League. This is their chance to see the real champions of Australian football, stars of which they have read and stars of which they will read again. Today we will see just how good those champions are when matched against the best that this State can provide.

A magnificent display of football should be seen because no longer is Tasmania the cinderella State of Australian football. No longer can Victoria expect to humiliate us with

a crushing win. Recent victories against West Australia, South Australia and the V.F.A. and a narrow defeat by the V.F.L. in Hobart a couple of years ago have made Tasmania the logical contenders for the championship title held by Victoria.

Today's programme is all the more attractive as it is in the nature of a double bill. Preceding the V.F.L. v. T.F.L. match is the game between the Tasmanian Amateur Football League and the Victorian Amateur Football Association. This, too, promises to be a superb exhibition of the amateur code with an exciting finish on the cards. In last year's Amateur Carnival in Perth, the Tasmanian team was only two straight kicks short of defeating the Victorian champions. That is the closest margin ever between the two and, like their senior counterparts, the Tasmanians in twelve games have never had the satisfaction of defeating Victoria. They hope to do the trick this afternoon.

Congratulations to those responsible for arranging these two games and good luck to the Tasmanian teams. A joint celebration of a double victory would be a fitting climax to a day on which a mighty crowd will enjoy the real champagne of football.

## LIKELY WIN TO V.F.L. BUT TASMANIANS WILL MAKE THEM EARN IT

No one could reasonably select Tasmania to defeat the V.F.L. in their clash this afternoon. However a completely different complexion has come over games between these two States from that which prevailed a few short years ago. No longer are Tasmanians overawed by the vigour and hard bumping tactics of the Victorians. They've now learned to play the same way and to hang out a bit extra in return. We have John Leatham, Mal Pascoe and Jeff Patterson to thank for that. No longer are the Vics. regarded as supermen as was vividly illustrated in Hobart in 1957 when we lost by only 15 points and in Devonport last year.

Reputations now mean nothing and a few more reputations could get dented today. For instance, Murray Weideman and Ken Fraser are two "big" name players, one of whom will be at centre half forward. Ivan Hayes is just the boy to pull them back to the field. And if he can't, Barry Strange can be switched to centre half back to do it for him.

Verdun Howell, of course, will hold no fears for Stan Morcom. Howell had left City before Morcom arrived but no doubt Morcom knows all about him. Theirs could be an exciting clash because both have improved since moving interstate.

Some of the Tasmanians of course now have reputations which could well overawe the Victorians for a

change. For instance Strange, Don Gale and Jim Ross have all won Australian blazers and they don't grow on trees. Ross has more experience and no less ability than any of John O'Connell, John Winneke, John Peck and even Frank Johnstone whom he'll meet in the ruck. And when Thorold Merrett and Bill Goggin have finished dealing with Stuart Spencer, Trevor Leo and Bernie Payne, they're going to get a shock when they find Gale waiting for them to help them "rest" in a pocket.

Darrel Baldock's fame no doubt will have reached the Victorians' ears and they'll be planning in advance how to stop him. Plan all they want, they still won't stop him. He'll be far too good and I say that with confidence. The Vics. haven't selected a regular centre-half back to play on him. They should have.

Another boy who'll give the visitors a shock is ruckman Garth Smith. He's a beauty. Ken Sheehan, too, will give Lance Oswald some hurry-up in the centre with his blistering pace.

It will be interesting to see the outcome of the clash if Jack Hawksley, with his vigour and experience, is pitted against the dashing Geoff Case. Hawksley was a Carnival star when Case was a only a boy. Time will tell — perhaps on the "Old Fox."

**WEIDEMAN, Murray.**—Collingwood's brilliant and provocative captain and centre half forward.  
**MERRETT, Thorold.**—Diminutive veteran, one of the most brilliant rover-wingers the game has seen.  
**MITCHELL, Hugh.**—Second trip to Tasmania with Victorian team. A ruck-rover, he's Essendon's answer to Melbourne's Ron Barassi.

**BIRT, John.**—Went to Essendon from St. Patrick's College, Ballarat, after clearance wrangle, as understudy to Bill Hutchinson.

**FRASER, Ken.**—Essendon's star centre half forward. By no means a veteran but played for Victoria at Devonport last year.

**GOGGIN, Bill.**—Geelong's star rover who is adept at delivering sizzling stabacks when sprinting flat out.

**BALDOCK, Darrel.**—One of Australia's most brilliant footballers. First came under notice when playing for Tasmania about ten years ago in the Schoolboys' Carnival. Has been eagerly sought by many V.F.L. Clubs but chose to remain as coach of Latrobe.

**CONLAN, Neil.**—Brilliant utility forward, wing, centre or follower. Formerly of New Town, is now playing coach of Devonport.

**FITZALLEN, John.**—Normally a centreman, will be on the wing today. Has an amazing capacity for getting the ball.

**GALE, Don.**—Superb back pocket player in big games. Australian blazer winner.

**GEARD, Rex.**—Veteran Sandy Bay ruckman who held permanent place in Richmond team while in Victoria.

## AROUND THE GROUND *with Cyclops*

You certainly get some variety in these V.F.L. teams. Although eleven of the Tasmanians who played at Devonport last year will be taking the field again (Ross, Geard, Steele, Shadbolt, Fitzallen, Leo, Conlan, Strange, Gale, Moore and Baldoek), only two of the Victorians have come back for more. They are the Essendon pair, Hugh Mitchell and Ken Fraser.

You win, Mr. Martin. It's Don Gale.

Have you noticed the coincidence with the coaches of the two Amateur teams for today? They are both Martins. The Victorian coach is Ray Martin of the famous Richmond ruck combination Dyer, Bolger and Martin. The Tasmanian coach is John Martin, the former star forward of Sandy Bay, City and Old Launcestonians who won an Australian Amateur blazer, an Amateur Carnival Best and Fairest Award from full forward in the weakest team and, what is not generally known, a New South Wales State guernsey when stationed there with the Army during the war. One of these two will almost certainly be coach of the Australian Amateur team later this year. I favour the chances of John Martin.

It is interesting that in both the Amateurs and the Seniors (that's the most appropriate term I can de-

vised to distinguish conveniently the two codes), Tasmania has put up its best performances against Victoria in recent years. Although Tasmania has never beaten Victoria in either sphere, the lowest losing margin in the Seniors was 15 points in 1957. The lowest losing margin in the Amateurs was 9 points last year (although this was equalled in 1932). The Amateurs had lost their four previous encounters by over 100 points. All told the Victorians have won three of their thirteen Senior victories by over 100 points and six of their twelve Amateur wins by over 100.

The Old Launcestonians play a significant part in Amateur football. Although there are thirteen other Amateur Clubs in the State, there are six Old Launcestonians in today's Tasmanian team including both the captain and vice-captain. They also have provided the coach, the State Secretary (Mr. D. V. Gunn) and the State President (Mr. E. J. Coulter). Mr. Gunn is also the Federal Secretary while Mr. Coulter was last year's Federal President. They have only once failed to have a player in the Australian Amateur team and that was in the last Carnival. Even then they supplied the Manager of the team in the person of Mr. Gunn.

quoted last week concerning the number of centre bounces in a game in which each team scores 4 goals. There are, in fact, 12 bounces — not 8 as suggested. There is one at the start of each quarter and one after each goal. The only time there could be less is where an infringement occurs before the bounce and a free kick is awarded instead.

Speaking of technicalities, here is a curly one. If a player makes a grab at a mark just inside the goal line but needs a second grab before finally holding it behind the goal line, what is the decision?

Another more clear cut one that frequently crops up is this. When a player marks cleanly practically right on the goal line, goal umpires have frequently been known to signal a behind. That, of course, is incorrect. If he marked the ball before it crossed the line, it's a mark. If he marked it after it crossed the line, it's a goal. It cannot ever be behind.

It will be interesting to see if the order-off rule is employed today during the Amateur match. Under Amateur rules the umpire has power to order a player from the field and he cannot be replaced. It isn't often used but it has been used a couple of times in Launceston in recent years. I understand it has a very sobering effect. Wouldn't it go over well in, say, the Colling-

wood outer if Murray Weideman got ordered off? It would be had enough at York Park.

Browsing through the "N.W.F.U. Record" issue for the Devonport game last year between the V.F.L. and Tasmanians, I found that "Coaster" had predicted "plenty of red blooded action." There sure was, I wonder if the same will happen today.

Things must be tough in Victoria when they can't dig up a decent full back of their own. The V.F.L. selected two teams for today, one to play South Australia and one to play Tasmania, and a Tasmanian got the full back job in both. Bob Johnson (ex-North Launceston) is playing against the Saussies and Verdun Howell (ex-City) is playing here at York Park. The Victorian full back a couple of years ago was another Tasmanian, Peter Marquis, who was formerly of Devonport.

There should be a terrific crowd of people from the North West Coast in Launceston today. Normally they are keen enough on football — especially top class football — but with half the Tasmanian team made up of spud busters they'll be here in droves. It's the biggest representation they've ever had and, with the thrashing they handed out to the N.T.F.A. who in turn had belted the T.F.L., they've thoroughly deserved it.

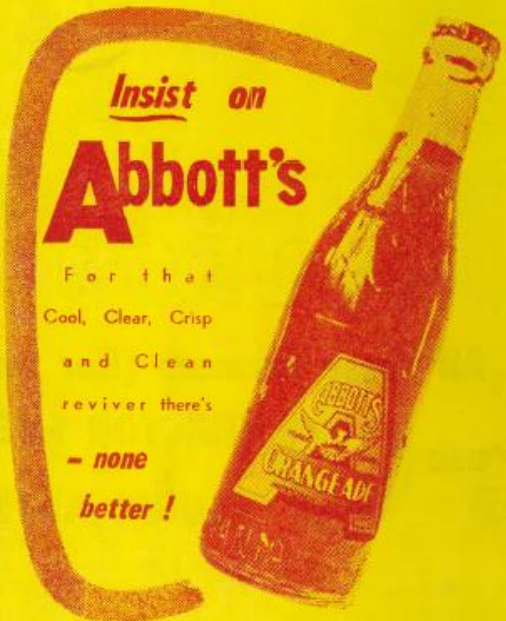
